How can you help your cub get the most from their scouting experience?”

Our program methodology is based on the new Canadian Path, which focuses on the youth leadership in determining their own program and personal goals. This is a very heady ambition but with your help we can achieve a fairly high degree of achievement.



The cubs are in small groups called lairs. Each has a leader(s) “advisor/mentor” and a ten year old cub called a Howler. This basic unit is guided by the leader mentor and meets frequently to consider adventure options using the Jungle Map as a guide. Ideas are shared among the lairs and adventures chosen by the cubs and the howler will be active in making arrangements to make that adventure happen. (We will be there all through this process.)

Personal and lair goals are also discussed and kept track of with the leader for making a goal come true somewhere down the road.

The tool for the cubs is the Journey Binder. Each cub has or will have one to take to each meeting. It’s this binder that can be used to develop your assistance in keeping (by understanding and reminding) your cubs focus on creating and following up on the adventure ideas.



THE BINDER WILL CONTAIN:

A copy of the Jungle Map

Updates from scout tracker on the adventure ideas and accomplishments

A description of the Personal Achievement Badges that the cub can choose to work on using the plan/do/review sheets included

A pix of the uniform for badge placements
